DAILY BIBLE READINGS - Week of August 31, 2025 "Bible Trilogies: His"

HIS LAW

SundayRead Psalm 1:1-7

"But his delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law doth he meditate day and night." The Word of God declares the law of God. There is no more important law than God's law. We read this about God's law in Psalm 19:7: "The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul: the testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple." Never has God's law had to be amended! We read in that verse in Psalms that explains knowing God's law and compliance to God's law results in the conversion of the soul. The soul of a converted person results in eternal life in heaven rather than eternal life in hell. The blood of Jesus fulfilled God's law stated in Leviticus 17:11: "For the life of the flesh is in the blood: and I have given it to you upon the altar to make an atonement for your souls: for it is the blood that maketh an atonement for the soul." Receiving the Lord Jesus gains for the believer, a home in heaven.

HIS COMMANDMENTS

MondayRead Psalm 112:1-3

"Praise ye the Lord. Blessed is the man that feareth the Lord, that delighteth greatly in his commandments." Those people who delight in the commandments of God are blessed indeed! Those commandments are in the Bible, the Word of God. The Holy Scriptures are the manual for living our lives as God intended. That is the truth recorded in II Timothy 3:16: "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness." It is vital that a person reads God's Word in order to live as God planned for humanity.

HIS EYES AND EARS

Tuesday......Read Psalm 34:15-20

"The eyes of the LORD are upon the righteous, and his ears are open unto their cry." The greatest privilege of being a follower of Jesus is the privilege of praying to God. That is mentioned in Romans 5:2: "By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God." Our God in heaven is looking for people on His earth to be ambassadors for the Kingdom of Heaven. That is the truth detailed in II Chronicles 16:9: "For the eyes of the Lord run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to shew himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward him." Also, God is listening to His followers to respond to their prayers. That is the high privilege of true Christians.

HIS SON

WednesdayRead John 3:16-17

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." The most commonly quoted verse in the Bible contains the world's most important truth. It is the gospel wrapped up in one verse, the good news that a person can have everlasting life. That comes with the decision to receive Jesus as Savior. To receive Jesus means a home in heaven. The failure to receive Jesus means an eternity in hell. The love of God compelled Him to provide a way to forgive sinful humanity. That way was for God to send His Son to pay the penalty of sin with His shed blood on the cross of Calvary!

HIS LOVE

Thursday Read Romans 5:1-8

"But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." The epitome of love is the love of God. The fact that God sent His Son to earth to die for us demonstrates a sacrificial love. This verse in Roman 5 shows that the love of God is an unconditional love, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. God did not tell us to clean up our act and He'll accept us. He did say accept my Son and I'll accept you. And, as we read in Romans 8:39, God's love is inseparable: "Wor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

HIS PEOPLE

Friday Read Psalm 94:10-14

"For the Lord will not cast off his people, neither will he forsake his inheritance."

We read here the guarantee for eternal life for the people of God. Who are those people? God's people are those who have become part of His family by receiving Jesus as Savior. That is the guarantee expressed in John 1:12: "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name." By receiving Jesus as a gift from God you have the gift of eternal life. We read that in Romans 6:23: "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." We read in Romans 8:17: "And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together."

HIS NAME

SaturdayRead Acts 11:26-28

"And when he had found him, he brought him unto Antioch. And it came to pass, that a whole year they assembled themselves with the church, and taught much people. And the disciples were called Christians first in Antioch." The Christian church actually had its beginning in Jerusalem on the Day of Pentecost. For quite a while, believers were

known as those who followed "The Way." As the church spread to other cities throughout the Mid-East, it finally came to Antioch. It is there that those who became the followers of Christ were referred to as Christians. That is true up until our time. It should be understood, however, that not all people who call themselves Christians really are. To call yourself a Christian, a person must personally receive Jesus as Savior. That private prayer is what makes a person a true Christian.
