DAILY BIBLE READINGS - Week of October 26, 2025 "Bible Trilogies: "Put" TRUSTING GOD

Sunday Read Psalm 56:3-10

"What time I am afraid, I will trust in Thee." True believers, those who have accepted Jesus to be their personal Savior, have what might be the greatest privilege of all times. They can call on God at anytime. God told us that in Jeremiah 33:3: "Call unto me, and I will answer thee, and show thee great and mighty things, which thou knowest not." That truly is a great comfort in those times when we are gripped with fear. Many things may cause fear, especially in times of uncertainty. We might ask ourselves what does the future hold. Christians know the future, and we can trust Him as our Lord to get us through whatever! Believers would do well to apply the truth of Philippians 4:6-7: "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."

NEW MAN

MondayRead Colossians 3:8-10

"Lie not one to another, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds. And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of Him that created him." The human being was made in the image of God, a triune being with a body, soul, and spirit. That made it possible for man to take pleasure in the physical world and the spiritual world. When Satan convinced Adam and Eve to eat of the forbidden fruit, they lost their fellowship with God, as a matter of fact, they hid from God. All humans born of man and woman are born with a dead spirit. When any individual receives Jesus as Savior, the spirit is regenerated. They become a new person with a new life as part of the family of God!

NEW HEART Tuesday......Read Ezekiel 36:25-30

"A new heart will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and I will give you an heart of flesh." The prophet when he talks about getting a new heart, he is not talking about a heart transplant. Ezekiel in today's Bible reading is talking about bringing glory to God. That is the truth of I Corinthians 10:31: "Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God." To have a new heart means a new life as part of God's family on earth. The heart's desire of a Christian is to please our Heavenly Father, to bring glory to the kingdom of heaven. Believers have temporal goals and responsibilities; but even with that, their heart's desire is to do it in a way that honors God! The apostle Paul made reference to that new heart that God gives us in Galatians 2:20: " I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life

which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me."

ARMOR OF GOD

WednesdayRead Ephesians 6:11-18

"Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil." One of the many appropriate titles for our Lord is mentioned in Hebrews 2:10: "For it became him, for whom are all things, and by whom are all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings." That is a military term and validates the fact that there is an on-going spiritual war on God's earth. That is the point of emphasis in I Peter 5:8: "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour." In fighting these battles against Satan, Christians need to put on daily spiritual armor to engage victoriously. That includes the girdle of truth, the breastplate of righteousness, the boots of peace, the shield of faith, the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit which is the Word of God.

GOD'S WORD

Thursday Read Hebrews 4:12-16

"For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart." The sword of the Spirit, God's Word, is vital in winning battles. Jesus exemplified that in winning a battle against Satan as we see in Matthew 4:3-4: "And when the tempter came to him, he said, If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread. But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." The quoting of Scripture caused the devil to admit defeat, and he left. Quoting Scriptures is the key to winning battles. To quote Scripture means the Christian must memorize verses in God's Word!

ALLEGIANCE TO GOD

Friday Read Proverbs 3:1-5

"My son, forget not my law; but let thine heart keep my commandments." The pledge of allegiance to the American flag was instituted in the fall of 1892. It was for many years a common practice in the public schools of the United States for the students to start every school day by quoting that pledge along with the reading of a passage from the Bible. More important for Christians is to pledge allegiance to God to start every day. That is the instruction in today's Bible reading from Proverbs 3:1 to keep God's commandments.

Saturday...... Read I John 5:1-5

"For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith." The life of faith in God is a life of victory. Armies

claim victory when they win battles, nations claim victory when they win wars. Either way, it results in celebration. In a way of speaking, worship services are celebrations. The singing in those services is a wonderful way for Christians to celebrate! Gathering for worship is one way to experience the victorious life.
