"Bible Trilogies: "Ten"

INSTRUCTIONS

SundayRead Psalm 10:1-10

"The wicked, through the pride of his countenance, will not seek after God: God is not in all his thoughts." God instructs His people that they should not worry when troublesome times come. These times are merely opportunities for God to show His almighty power. The tougher the battle, the greater is the victory! The best way for a believer to show his or her faith is to engage in prayer and reading the Bible. Such a practice builds our faith. By reading God's Word and speaking to Him, we have brought the Almighty Creator into the picture. We are never alone, and it is important to sense and benefit from the indwelling Holy Spirit! We were given this very important command in Philippians 4:6 NIV: *"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."*

TEN BROTHERS

MondayRead Genesis 37:1-2

"These are the generations of Jacob. Joseph, being seventeen years old, was feeding the flock with his brethren; and the lad was with the sons of Bilhah, and with the sons of Zilpah, his father's wives: and Joseph brought unto his father their evil report." One of the closest relationships people have is with their siblings. One of the best ways for those so blessed to honor their father and mother is to get along with brothers and sisters. The family is a primary target of Satan, God's enemy. One of the great ways to live a victorious Christian life is in our treatment of brothers and sisters. Joseph demonstrated that when he was terribly mistreated by his brothers. God recorded his experience in the Bible for us to benefit from his example.

KINDNESS

TuesdayRead Genesis 42:25-32

"Then Joseph commanded to fill their sacks with corn, and to restore every man's money into his sack, and to give them provision for the way: and thus did he unto them." What an example Joseph was in living a life that honored God! He did not seek revenge for the way his brothers treated him when he had the opportunity. One of his brothers suggested a plan that would result in his death. What they did was sell him to traders causing Joseph to end up as a slave in Egypt. God used this difficult experience as an opportunity for Joseph to show kindness. When they needed food, he provided plenty. He demonstrated God's

instruction in Romans 12:21: *"Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good."*

COMMANDMENTS

Wednesday Read Exodus 20:1-10

"And God spake all these words, saying." The commandment that God gave Moses to serve as the rule of law for the nation which God would form are recorded in the Bible. That meant they are God's instructions for His people. For the most part, they apply to the New Covenants. Jesus Himself made reference to them in Matthew 19:16-19. The one exception would be the designated day for worship. The seventh day was designated in God's old Covenant. The New Covenant, according to I Corinthians 16:2: *"Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him, that there be no gatherings when I come."*

NEIGHBORS

Thursday Read Matthew 22:36-39

"And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself." If our Father in heaven loves His world, the whole earth, we His children, should certainly love our world! We have been placed by God right where He wants us. If we, as Christians, are in a neighborhood, and we are God's spiritual light in our area. That is the teaching of Jesus in Matthew 5:14: *"Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid."* The actions of Christians should show that they are Spirit-led and Spirit-filled! When God opens the door, we can share a verbal witness.

SERVANTS

Friday Read Luke 19:10-13

"And he called his ten servants, and delivered them ten pounds, and said unto them, Occupy till I come." Jesus gave ten servants an assignment to do for Him. As it turned out, only one carried out his duty and returned with the profits of his labor. It was then that Jesus asked, "Where are the nine?" Is that not true in the world today? Only a small fraction of professing believers in Christ as Savior and Lord are faithful in the calling to share God's message. Be one that does!

AMBASSADORS

Saturday Read II Corinthians 5:15-20

"Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God." This may well be the most important assignment for Christians: ambassadors for the Kingdom of

Heaven! Since heaven is the eternal home for true believers, we are now living in a country to which we are ambassadors for Christ. Jesus, on the cross, paid the penalty of all sinners; that means for everyone in the world. God, the Father so loved the world that He did not want the people to spend an eternity in the lake of fire prepared for the devil. That is the truth of Romans 5:8: "*But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.*" Believers are to share that message to all we can! Our homes are an embassy in a foreign land.
